In the main living area, the fireplace is topped with a beautiful old wooden intel, bought years ago by homeowner Möller Bester (with no particular purpose in mind at the time) after he spotted an online classified advertisement for 'a vellowwood beam' at a good price. 'My dad was in the forestry business and | grew up on a sawmill. so I know a little bit about wood, says Ronelle. 'To this day I'm convinced the beam is not yellowwood, but it's a beautiful piece of wood with leftover bits of paint on it. and initials carved into it too - it has lots of character.

And the Besters seldom visit on their own. We built the house to entertain family and friends, so we hardly go alone,' says Ronelle. We love to share our house and show the area to our friends.' Both the house and its surroundings are, she adds, all about the simple life, whether that means cycling to go and buy bread and milk at the local shop, greeting fellow locals, or simply spending quality time at the beach. Heading through to nearby Velddrif to buy fresh seafood would constitute a veritable expedition – so the Besters usually pick up some fish there on their way to the house at the start of the weekend.

The house was 'dreamed of and planned for years,' says Ronelle, and finally built three years ago. The Besters worked with architect Charl Marais of CFM Architecture on the design to ensure that the house has maximum appeal, with sea views from every room, and a range of different spaces in the house that cater to the needs of all those using it, from kids to grownups. So, there is a 'pyjama lounge' upstairs where

the children can hang out together, for example, as well as a living room on the ground floor for the adults.

Spaces in which to spend time preparing meals and eating with family and friends were a priority too, of course. These include the west-facing stoep (veranda) at the front of the house, complete with a built-in braai (barbecue), as well as the internal open-plan kitchen and dining area. Asked about her best spot in the house, Ronelle says it 'must be the kitchen with the antique table where everyone gathers, chats, cooks, eats – it's just a happy space. You have uninterrupted views of the sea, so we spend hours there.'

The windproof courtyard at the rear of the house is another favourite space, and no wonder, when it features a wood-fired hot tub (by KolKol

kolkol.co.xa) as well as additional outdoor seating. This secluded spot also includes a fully grown olive tree that Ronelle moved here from the farm. I didn't want to wait years for a new one to grow,' she says, and despite no one believing that it would survive the journey, it is now 'my miracle tree ... happy and thriving'.

An average day at Villa Kersbos begins with a breakfast of bacon and eggs (cooked by Möller) after which the morning is spent on the beach—swimming, stand-up paddle boarding, and bodyboarding. Julian and Josua are also currently learning to surf: 'The sea in front of the house is very safe,' says Ronelle, 'and the waves are ideal for learning.'

Plenty of activity is an essential element of a holiday here, but when anyone wants a bit of quiet time, the house allows for this too. Each of the bedrooms is marvellously spacious, and they all have en-suite bathrooms and private outdoor access. Plus, the design of all the spaces reflects the spirit of ease that Ronelle, working in collaboration with interior designer Elsjé Schonken, has created throughout the house.





R&R

The main bedroom on the ground floor opens right up to the views of indigenous fynbos vegetation and the Atlantic Ocean beyond, and includes an en-suite bathroom and a freestanding bath in one corner of the room, from which the views can be enjoyed. Ronelle says the ocean is usually dotted with cargo ships, which can be spotted moving past day and night. The four-poster bed is from Weylandts (weylandts.co.za), with a botanical print fabric hanging from Babylonstoren (babylonstoren.com). The rug and textured bedspread are by Hertex Haus (hertexhaus.co.za), and the bedside tables were made using old gumtree stumps from the Besters' farm. The woven light fittings, woven lounge chair and deep green cushions are all also from Weylandts.

A place to rest ->

This large bedroom on the first floor opens up onto a spacious balcony. The coir rug is from Hertex Haus (hertexhaus.co.za), the wooden chest of drawers is from Block & Chisel (blockandchisel.co.za), the wire table lamp is from Loads of Living (truworths.co.za), and the wood and leather rocking chairs are by incanda (incanda.co.za). The round occasional table is from @home (home.co.za).



Their judicious selection of natural textures includes lots of wooden pieces, many of them family heirlooms or items tracked down at various vintage stores. These are beautifully complemented by a palette of neutral tones – enlivened with subtle splashes of green – and it all combines to create a tranquil yet warm, layered feel. As Ronelle puts it, she and all the other visitors to Villa Kersbos 'love to throw open all the doors and live free', and this atmosphere of simple, effortless liberty is what time spent at this house is all about. cfmarch.com. schonkeninterioc.com
